## NHF DELIVERS

With programs addressing community health, patient safety, and length of hospital stay, NHF continues to make resounding contributions in quality improvements and cost savings within the health care continuum. Since inception, NHF's Recuperative Care Program saved Southern California hospitals more than \$30 million through cost prevention.
