#### **2015 Palliative Care Conference: From Concept to Collaboration**

The Hospital Association of Southern California and the Inland Empire Palliative Care Coalition have joined together to present, Supportive Care and Palliative Care: from Concept to Collaboration, an engaging conference focusing on best practices causing acceleration of these cost-effective approaches to care management treatment goals for patients transitioning across the continuum of pre and post-hospitalization.
