LARRY BRILLIANT, M.D., M.P.H.

Dr. Larry Brilliant is a physician and epidemiologist, CEO of Pandefense Advisory, senior advisor at the Skoll Foundation and a CNN Medical Analyst. Previously he served on the board of the Skoll Foundation and was Chair of the Advisory Board of the NGO Ending Pandemics. He was also the president and CEO of the Skoll Global Threats Fund, vice president of Google and the founding executive director of Google.org. He co-founded the Seva Foundation, whose programs have given back sight to more than five million blind people in two dozen countries.

Dr. Brilliant lived in India for nearly a decade where he was a key member of the successful WHO Smallpox Eradication Programme for southeast Asia as well as the WHO Polio Eradication Programme. He served as chair of the National Biosurveillance Advisory Committee created by President George W. Bush, and as a member of the World Economic Forum's Agenda Council on Catastrophic Risk. He has also served as a "first responder" for CDC's bio-terrorism response effort.

His recent awards include the TED Prize, Time magazine's 100 Most Influential People, an International Public Health Hero award, and four honorary doctorates. Brilliant is the author of **Sometimes Brilliant:** *The Impossible Adventure of a Spiritual Seeker and Visionary Physician Who Helped Conquer the Worst Disease in History,* a memoir about working to eradicate smallpox, and *The Management of Smallpox Eradication*, a guide to managing vaccination programs.

LEON LOGOTHETIS

Leon Logothetis is a global adventurer, motivational speaker and philanthropist. It wasn't always that way. He used to be a broker in the city of London where he felt uninspired and chronically depressed. He gave it all up for a life on the road. This radical life change was inspired by the inspirational movie, *The Motorcycle Diaries.*

As host of the Netflix series *The Kindness Diaries*, Logothetis circumnavigated the globe on his vintage yellow motorbike dubbed Kindness One, presenting life-changing gifts to people in need. He recently returned from filming the second season of *The Kindness Diaries*, in which he traveled from Alaska to Argentina in his vintage yellow VW Beetle, Kindness Two, changing lives one mile at a time.

Leon has documented his travels for numerous media outlets including *Good Morning America, The Los Angeles Times, The San Francisco Chronicle, Outside, Psychology Today,* and *The New York Times.*
