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# Roundtables Will Review Proposed Workplace Violence Rules Changes

al/OSHA's new health care workplace violence prevention regulations are expected to go into effect on Oct. 1. To prepare for the change, hospitals and health systems are evaluating their current safety and security plans and determining what additional steps are necessary to comply with the updated regulations.

New rule changes will affect how organizations comply with training obligations, patient assessments, interdisciplinary communication and record-keeping.

As the deadline approaches, four HASC-facilitated roundtable meetings will provide an overview of the proposed changes as well as a chance for participants to share their organizations' efforts to prepare for the regulations and strategize on how to overcome potential challenges.
