Session Description

This one-day program moves the focus of palliative care's rapid evolution to the post-hospital continuum of care. The current challenge facing the industry is connecting the patient and family into an integrated, affordable, seamless glide path to access appropriate "after care" services, now largely provided in disparate settings and processes. These public and governmental expectations are grounded in the health care reform legislation. Organized, integrated medical groups, foundations, community clinics, independent physician offices, hospital-based clinics, nursing homes, skilled nursing facilities, hospice and home health care, convalescent care centers, assisted living, and community senior center resources <u>all</u> must connect in a rational, efficient, compassionate, quality-based fashion, thus saving futile care costs, unnecessary re-hospitalizations and procedures. Doing so is our responsibility as stakeholders in palliative care. Learn from an expert faculty of innovators on how to move this agenda and deliver what this growing population of patients and their families are expecting from the industry.
