Charge Nursing: Leading from the Middle will be reviewed briefly.

Among the course objectives:

- Evaluate unit readiness for any type of survey.
- Discuss measures that would improve a unit's safety culture, including hourly rounding, effective shift reporting, simulation drills for critical events, debriefing

after critical/unusual events, effective feedback to frontline staff and response to critical events.
