EMS Accepts LA County EMS/UCLA Pilot for Community Paramedicine

The California State EMS Authority has approved both community paramedicine pilot projects (AlTrans and COMPARE) submitted by the Los Angeles County EMS Agency and developed by the UCLA Center for Prehospital Care. These proposals specifically focus on alternative patient destination and congestive heart failure – 30-day readmissions. All projects must be locally financed.

Community paramedic medicine seeks to expand the scope of practice for paramedics who undergo enhanced training through a new and evolving model of community-based health care. The goal is to facilitate more appropriate use of

emergency care resources and enhance access to primary care. There is growing interest in this model of care given the potential to improve access and quality.

The EMS Authority will now forward the approved projects to OSHPD for final approval, which is expected in April 2014. OSHPD will conduct hearings and accept public comment in February 2014.

Hospitals and Orange County Convene to Discuss Mental Health System Improvements

Orange County hospitals, emergency room physicians and Orange County Behavioral Health have teamed up to discuss improvements that could be made in Orange County's mental health delivery system, with the goal of preparing a collaboratively developed grant application in the SB 82 grant program authored by Senate President Pro Tem Darrell Steinberg and approved by the legislature this year.

The primary objective of the effort is to rapidly transition patients experiencing psychiatric emergencies into the most appropriate treatment setting, expanding capacity within the county as necessary to achieve this goal. The strong potential for public/private partnerships is a cornerstone of the discussion.

The grant proposals would seek to expedite care for all patients experiencing psychiatric emergencies, and bypass hospital emergency departments in favor of more appropriate care settings (mental health clinics, crisis stabilization units and psychiatric emergency services facilities) when possible, as well as reduce the need for involuntary patient treatment.

HASC/LA County to Offer Hospital Disaster Management Training Dec. 3-4

The next quarterly session of Hospital Disaster Management Training provided by Los Angeles County's Department of Health Services/Emergency Medical Services Agency's Disaster Resource Center Program is scheduled for Dec. 3-4 at LAC+USC Medical Center.

The in-depth training on hospital surge capacity management for natural disasters and CBRNE incidents will leave participants with knowledge of how to:

• Describe Southern California's disas-

ter capabilities.

- Identify triage priorities in disaster patients.
- Perform a role in the hospital command center and emergency department during a disaster drill.
- Describe health care facilities' role in a disaster.

Featuring lectures, skill sessions, tabletop and functional exercises, as well as immediate feedback and evaluation, the course costs \$150 per student. Continuing education credits are available.
