Dear Mr. Porter:

Riverside University Health System (RUHS) provides a variety of health services for the public. A network of eleven (11) community health centers strategically located throughout the county offer the following health services:

- Outpatient Primary Care
- Nutrition Management
- Screening and Treatment for Communicable Diseases
- Pregnancy Care
- Family Planning/Teen Clinics
- Child Health Services
- Immunizations
- Cancer Screening
- Referrals to Specialists
- Dental (Rubidoux Community Health Center)
- Prescriptions and Refills

The immunizations services offered at the eleven (11) Community Health Centers include:

- Vaccine for Children (VFC) for Medicaid-eligible, uninsured, underinsured and American Indian or Alaska Native children.
- 317 vaccines, which are federally purchased vaccines for adults who are uninsured and underinsured.
- State funded influenza vaccine, which is offered annually at no cost.

See attachment I for the Community Health Centers (RUHS-CHC) locations and business hours. Currently there are no other county-contracted immunization locations.

The most common diseases reported in Riverside County are listed on Attachment II. Per Dr. Cameron Kaiser, Public Health Officer, screening among the homeless population is recommended for the following diseases:

- Syphilis
- Tuberculosis (Chest X-Ray if signs and symptoms suggestive of TB)
- Hepatitis A
- Salmonella (if gastrointestinal symptoms are present)
- Shigella (if gastrointestinal symptoms are present)

RUHS Disease Control and HIV/STD staff follow-up on reports of individuals with infectious diseases to facilitate treatment if indicated and evaluation of exposed individuals. In addition, designated TB staff coordinate with hospital case managers and/or Infection Preventionists to ensure patients who have or who are suspected of having infectious TB are appropriately discharged according to statute.

Public Health collaborates with the medical community, hospitals, community based organizations and other stakeholders to protect the health and well-being of the community. Please contact us at (951) 358-5107 if we may be of assistance.
